## Interview with an ISP Alumna

## **Truc Pham**

Joining us today is Truc Pham, an alumna of Cypress College's International Students Program who transferred to California State University at Long Beach to major in Hospitality Management in the Fall of 2016.



Hello Truc! Thank you for taking your time out of your busy schedule to help us with our Newsletter! Can you briefly introduce yourself to our readers?

My name is Truc Pham. I am an international student at Cal State Long Beach (CSULB) from Vietnam majoring in Hospitality Management and before transferring to CSULB, I was a part of the International Students' Program here at Cypress College.

Let's go back to your first days at Cypress. Most of our previous students were initially impressed by the duck pond. Can you tell us why you made the decision to attend Cypress?

(Laughs) The pond is indeed very nice and it certainly made the environment at Cypress stand out from the other schools, which is one of the primary reasons why I decided to attend Cypress. I love beautiful settings and I think that pleasing environment can truly improve the quality of our work. That's why I chose Cypress, in addition to Cypress being close to my home here in the U.S. and a very diverse campus.

# That's wonderful! Before you came to Cypress though, what made you want to study abroad?

I have always wanted to study abroad since my days at University in Vietnam. I love to travel, to learn more about different cultures, to garner new experiences for myself and to broaden my perspectives. I actually have studied abroad previously in Germany and I loved it.

You must have had some really interesting experiences from both your time in Germany and at Cypress. Can you tell us about what was different for you when you were here at Cypress?

The educational setting here in the U.S. is dramatically different from that of Vietnam. Instructors here allow students to have more freedom to actively participate and discuss the learning material with other classmates during class meetings, which does not happen in Vietnam. My classmates are very open-minded and nobody will judge you if you are an older student. I also like that Cypress has a lot of activities organized by different clubs and organizations on campus every week.

# Sounds like you truly enjoyed your time at Cypress. Can you tell us more about your experience while you were at Cypress?

I have absolutely no complaint at all! Cypress has a wonderful faculty and curriculum, especially for Hospitality Management. The professors were extremely helpful during class and outside of class. Cypress is actually the only school within Orange County to have its own restaurant for its Hospitality Management students. As you just said, I truly did enjoy my time at Cypress.

# Oh my! I'm very happy that you had such a wonderful time here! Can you tell us a bit about your experience as a Hospitality Management major at CSULB?

It certainly is different from my experience at Cypress, but in a good way. The student body at CSULB is even more diverse than Cypress and my classes are now much bigger than my old classes at Cypress. However, my professors are still extremely helpful. They are also very diverse as well: I have a professor from China who worked in luxury hotels in Shanghai for most of his life, and another from Japan who specializes in Japanese dining!

That sounds amazing! I am elated to hear that despite your transition from Cypress to CSULB, you are still enjoying your experience studying abroad. Do you have any secret advice that you would like to let our readers in on?




